This includes management of support staff and program/clinical director.

Job Responsibilities

- The Vice President of Behavioral Health Services is responsible for operational leadership of YFA's array of community Behavioral Health services, including outpatient clinic services, and prevention services for child mental health disorders.
- The VP is also responsible for the integration of Behavioral Health services within YFA programs and services as well as with external service providers, and for the development and implementation of new behavioral health services to meet the needs of YFA's clients. While taking advantage of new opportunities in the community behavioral health system of care.
- The VP is responsible for participating in company-wide planning and work on a range of strategic and operational issues. Direct the implementation and monitoring of standards of excellence in prevention programs and services, and behavioral health services.
- The VP is responsible for the effective management of programs including oversight of quality, compliance, outcomes, staffing safety, service delivery and financial performance. Working with all administrative departments within YFA, the VP is responsible for ensuring appropriate use of resources to provide effective and efficient behavioral health services.
- Identify and maintain strategic linkage with local and state organizations, agencies and groups, in the area of Prevention, Behavioral Health and Medicaid services and programming whose influence, support and assistance could be of value to the organization.

- Remain aware of Medicaid rules and regulations nationally and in Florida to oversee the related functions in behavioral health services and to provide staff training
